

CE Interior Design II



Welcome to Interior Design II! This course will provide you with the opportunity to develop skills in applying the elements and principles of design to interiors. Projects are integrated throughout the course to provide applications as you learn about: architecture, furniture styles and constructions, surface treatments and backgrounds, design and function of space and lighting. Northridge does offer this class as Concurrent Enrollment so you will be able to earn college credit upon completing this course.

Materials Needed:

- 1. A set of colored pencils. You can get whatever set you like, the more colors you have the more fun you will have designing!
- 2. I have limited Interior magazines in the class that are also used for Interior Design I so you may want to purchase a couple of your own and bring them to class for when we do magazine assignments.
- 3. A notebook that you will use every day to write down the daily review statements.
- 4. You may need to purchase a few materials throughout the class as we do projects, I will inform you on those materials if needed.

Making up Work: we will be doing something every single day in this class. If you are ever absent it is your responsibility to find out what you need to do to catch up. We will be designing almost every day so it is very important that you attend class. Remember this class is a college course and it will be treated like one.

Late work: If you are absent you have 1 week to get in your makeup work without any late penalties. Late work will receive 5 minus points for each class day not turned in and assignments will not be accepted after 5 days.

Class Expectations:

- 1. Once again you are receiving college credit for this class so you will be expected to complete college level work as well as behave as you would in a college class.
- 2. Cell phones are permitted in class during work time but not during instruction time. Your phone will be taken away from you if it is a distraction during instructional periods.
- 3. Be an active participant in class. I want to hear your questions, comments, and concerns.
- 4. You will be required to complete assignments both in class and on CANVAS. You will be taught how to access CANVAS in class.
- 5. You will be given time in class to complete work. Use this time wisely as there is penalties for late work.
- 6. Respect the materials provided to you in class.
 - a. Do not write/draw on desks.
 - b. Do not break anything that does not belong to you.
 - c. Always clean up your mess.

7. You will need to register for this class through Weber State by the deadline given to receive college credit. There will be a \$30 registration fee and a \$15 tuition fee. This means that you are paying \$45 for a 3-credit college course that normally would cost you \$750 at the university!

Academic Grade: Because of the concentration of the subject matter, attendance is important! Tardies and absences will affect the student's opportunity to fully participate in the learning activities provided. Students will be graded on participation in each area. Individual assignments, group projects, and tests will contribute to the final grade

Citizenship Grade: The citizenship grade is of equal importance as the academic grade. Your behavior in class along with your participation will determine your citizenship grade. Each student starts out with an S (satisfactory). To maintain this grade, the student must be an active participant in class, hand in work, and obey class and school rules. To exceed to G (good) or and H (honor) You must earn it through daily behavior, work ethic, and assignment/food quality. All students have the right to learn and teachers have the right to teach, and there should be no interference.

Truancy will result in lowering citizenship one grade and all points will be forfeited for that day. No make-up work will be allowed. Truancy is an unexcused absence or sluffing.

Students will earn a U in citizenship when speaking or behaving inappropriately when a substitute is in class.

I really hope that you will enjoy this class. I hope that we will all be able to respect each other and become comfortable with each other. Because of the nature of the class, a lot of discussion will take place and will really enhance the effectiveness of the class. Please be ready to contribute to these discussions with your ideas, experiences and opinions!
